World War 2 – 1943

John Thompson Strategic analyst - quotes from his book "Spirit Over Steel"

Dec 20th: 1st Canadian Division starts to near Ortona, and 1st Fallschirmjager is continuing to fight tooth and nail to defend it. A radio operator in a B-17 on a raid over Bremen, Technical Sergeant Forrest L Vosler is injured in the legs by a 20mm cannon shell from a German fighter

plane. He understands that the tail gunner is worse injured and crawls back to relieve him and take over the guns. At this new post, he is again struck and injured in the eyes, face and chest; but he continues to fire. The pilot determines that the bomber will have to ditch in the sea. T/Sgt Vosler, by now effectively blind, returns to his radio set and repairs it by touch, getting off several distress calls. Once the plane ditches, he crawls out on the wing with the wounded tail gunner, holding on to him until other crewmen can get them both into a dinghy. His coolness and skill are inspirational to the rest of the crew, and result in the award of the Medal of Honor.

Dec 21st: The Soviets eradicate the last German pocket east of the Dnieper. Bomber Command hits sites for V-1s in the Pas de Calais region.

Dec 22nd: 1st Canadian Division seizes most of Ortona, but the German Fallschirmjager are proving especially tenacious and houses are contested room by room – this is a hard school for fighting in urban areas and both the Germans and Canadians will cite the lessons learned here in training for decades to come.

Dec 23rd: Fighting continues in Ortona, other elements of 8th Army liberate Arielli further inland.

Dec 24th: 1st Ukrainian Front goes after 4th Panzer Army in a series of attacks to re-establish control of the territory west of Kiev. US Cruisers bombard parts of Bougainville as a diversion from a planned US landing on New Britain. Eisenhower is named as the Supreme Allied Commander for Overlord. Over the next five days, most of the other main Allied command appointments will be named for Europe, the Middle East and the Mediterranean.

Essential Reading: Among the many recollections of the war, there are a few that are written from the point of view of someone who became a stress casualty. One of them is from the famous Canadian "writer Farley Mowat, who was a junior officer in a Canadian infantry battalion in Italy in 1943. The maelstrom around the crossing of the Moro River and the drive on Ortona figure heavily in his memoir And No Birds Sang and it is a candid self-portrait by somebody whose reserves of mental strength were drained flat.

Dec 25th: Scharnhorst sails north to intercept Convoy JW-55B. A US carrier raid on New Ireland succeeds in sinking one transport ship. The Soviet advance near Nevel cuts the Vitebsk –Polotsk railway. USS Skate puts a torpedo into the Yamato.
