The following Regulations, General Orders, etc., have been approved by His Excellency the Governor-in-Council and are promulgated to the Militia by the Honourable the Minister of Militia and Defence in Militia Council.

The following will be substituted for paragraphs 775 to 812:—

"7. Examination of Officers for promotion, Permanent Force."

775. An officer of the Permanent Staff will be required to pass the same examinations for promotion as an officer in an Infantry unit of the Permanent Force.

776. In order to ensure as far as possible, uniformity of system in examinations, an officer of the General Staff at Militia Headquarters will, from time to time, attend boards holding practical examinations in subjects (a) and (c) as an ex-officio member.

777. Brevet rank will not exempt an officer from passing the usual examinations laid down before promotion to each substantive grade.

778A. A Lieutenant of the R.C.A.M.C. during the first year of probation will be required to—

The exercise will also deal with the administration and supply of the force and the methods of preserving the health and maintaining the moral of the troops.

Subject (d) Written. Consisting of five papers, viz:—

When an Officer becomes due for promotion before attending the above courses, he may be promoted provisionally, provided that he has not already attended such a course and failed, and on the understanding that he attends a course at the first opportunity and gets a satisfactory certificate.

A. C.O. will state on the annual confidential report of such an officer the date on which he proposes to send him to undergo a course.

784. When an officer, previously qualified, is transferred from one arm of the service, or from one branch of the artillery, to another, he will be required to obtain the certificate of examination applicable to the new arm or branch before being considered qualified for further promotion.

785. Qualification for admission to the Staff College will be accepted in lieu of the whole of subjects (b) and (d).

An officer exempt as above will, however, be required to pass in subjects (a) and (c).

An officer who has graduated at the Staff College, Camberley, or the Staff College, Quetta, will be exempt from all examinations for promotions to the ranks of Captain and Major.

786. The standard required for a special certificate is given in Appendix X1 K. R. and O. (Imp.), 1912. A candidate who obtains a special certificate in the examination for promotion to captain:—

(1) Will be excused the examination in subjects (c) and (d) for promotion from Captain to Major.

(2) Will receive consideration when put forward for accelerated promotion. The fact of his gaining a special certificate in this examination will be a factor in his favour.

(3) Will receive a credit of marks in the competitive examination for admission to the Staff College.

Sub-paras. (2) and (3) will apply to captains who obtain a special certificate in promotion examination to major.

787. To be eligible to attend any examination for promotion to captain or major an officer must have attained the rank of lieutenant or captain respectively. He must also produce a certificate signed by his C.O. to the effect that he has tested the candidate and that he recommends him as fit to present himself for the examination. No candidate may attend a written examination (b) or (d) until he has passed in subjects (a) or (c) as the case may be. A candidate for examination in subjects (a) or (c) must be certified by his C.O. as fit for promotion as regards his competency to educate, instruct, train and lead his officers and men in barracks and in the field and as being in the C.O.'s opinion, suitable as regards his character bearing and energy for promotion to higher rank. The certificates in each case must be countersigned by the District Commander under whom the officer is serving who will add his remarks.

788. An officer who twice fails in subjects (a) or (c) will not as a rule be permitted to remain in the service. In exceptional cases the Militia Council will consider whether an officer shall be given a further opportunity of qualifying. An officer who fails will not be permitted without Militia Headquarters authority to present himself for re-examination within three months of his failure.*

Subjects (d), (e), (g), (h) (Lieutenant), (i), (o) or (p) may be taken up separately at any of the half yearly examinations.

An officer who fails in one sub-head only of (b), (d), (f), (g), (h), (i), (o) or (p) respectively will be required to undergo examination in that sub-head only. Failure in more than one sub-head of a subject will, however, entail re-examination in the whole of that subject. An officer who fails in the aggregate of subject (e) will be required to take up the whole subject again. For the purpose of partial failure in a subject, an officer who does not present himself for examination in a sub-head to which he is liable will, as a rule, be deemed to have failed in that sub-head.

789. A candidate for examination will apply to his C.O., who will forward all such applications through the usual channels to the District Commander accompanied by the certificates mentioned in para. 787.

790. District Commanders will forward so far as to reach Militia Headquarters not later than the 15th January and 15th July in each year a return on M.F.B. 404 of all officers in his command who are desirous of being examined in subjects (b), (d), (e), (g), (h) (Lieutenants), (i), (o) and (p). Should the date fixed for the examination in April be altered on account of the fall of Easter, the return should reach Militia Headquarters 14 days earlier.

*Cases may come to notice of officers commissioned since 4th August, 1914, who have not the qualifications in educational subjects to fit them to train their men to the necessary standard. Arrangements will be made in Districts, etc. by which such officers may be allowed to pass through an educational course ending with a test conducted by a board of officers. If as the result of this test the examining board is of the opinion that the general educational standard of any candidate is not sufficiently high to warrant his retention as an

officer the case will be referred, together with the papers and the candidate's work in the examination through the usual channels to Militia Headquarters. The Militia Council will then decide whether the officer is to be retained in the service or not.

793. To examine officers in subjects (a) and (c) a District Commander will select and appoint for a fixed term of not less than one year, if possible, officers of the various arms of the service, sufficient in number for all the examinations within the District. (a) and (c) boards will be separate. Boards will be formed from these officers who may be exempted from serving on other garrison boards. For an examination in subject (a) or (c), the board will consist of a president, not below the rank of Colonel for subject (c), and not below the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel for subject (a), and members not below the rank of major. When an officer not below the rank of colonel is not available for subject (c) a substantive lieutenant-colonel may be appointed president. A president and three members should constitute the board for the examination of eight candidates, and a president and two members may examine six or any less number of candidates. This proportion of members to candidates should, as a rule, be observed. An officer of the R.C.A.M.C. may be appointed a member of the board to assist in examining in questions of military hygiene. If such an officer is not available, the president of the board should consult with the medical authorities of the District in setting suitable questions in military hygiene in connection with the tactical scheme. When a candidate of the R.C.A.M.C. presents himself for examination in sub-head (a) (ii) or (c) (ii), an officer of the R.C.A.M.C. not below the rank of Major should be a member of

the board of examination. M.F.B. 383 will be used, on which the board will be required to certify that each officer has been thoroughly tested by them in subjects (a) or (c) as set forth in Appendix XI K.R. & O. (Imp.), 1912, and to record their opinion as to the officer's fitness for promotion in so far as the examination applies.

794. Examination in subjects (b), (d), (e) and (g) to (p) will be held at such centres as District Commanders may appoint, commencing on the third Monday in April and the third Monday in October in each year. Should Easter Monday or Good Friday fall in the third week in April the examination will commence on the first Monday in that month. Boards to supervise the examinations will consist of a lieutenant-colonel as president and two field officers as members. When there are less than six candidates at any sitting the board may consist of a president and one member only. If no officer of the rank of lieutenant-colonel is available, a field officer may be appointed as president, and the District order convening the board should state "No officer of the rank of lieutenant-colonel available". Boards of examination in subject (f) will be dealt with as laid down in Appendix VII.

(i) In the case of an examination in subject (a) or (c), the president of

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the board will forward the proceedings and results (on M.F.B. 383) to the District Commander, who, if satisfied that the examination has been conducted in accordance with the regulations, will sign the certificate on M.F.B. 383. If any irregularity has occurred the District Commander will decide whether the examination is to be annulled.

(ii) The District Commander will report the results of examinations in subjects (a) and (c) to Militia Headquarters without delay on M.F.B. 383. The names of officers who have qualified will be notified in Militia Orders, and such notification will be the authority for recording an officer as qualified in subject (a) or (c).

Each officer will be furnished by his C.O. with a certified copy of the notification. The proceedings of the boards of examination in subjects (a) and (c) will be retained at the District Headquarters. The work of candidates who obtain .8 in (a) or (c) will be forwarded, together with a copy of the scheme, with M.F.B. 383 to Militia Headquarters. The board will specially report whether it recommends that the result should count towards the officer getting a "Special Certificate". The annulling of an examination in subjects (a) or (c) will not count as failure for the purposes of para. 788.

(iii) In the case of subjects (b) and (d) the District Commander will transmit the proceedings to Militia Headquarters. The District Commander will be furnished with lists of successful and unsuccessful candidates from Militia Headquarters. The names of those officers who have passed or gained a special certificate will be notified in Militia orders and such notification will be the authority for recording an officer

as qualified in those subjects. Each officer will, in addition, be furnished direct from Militia Headquarters with a list of the marks he has obtained, and such communication may, if necessary, be produced as an authority.

797. Before he can be regarded as fully qualified for promotion a lieutenant of R.C.G.A., R.C.E. Infantry and Machine Gun Brigade not doing duty with a mounted branch, will be required to produce a certified copy of a certificate of proficiency in riding, which will always be appended to M.F.B. 383 by the board of examination in subject(a). The certificate may be obtained as laid down in para. 852. A candidate not in possession of such a certificate or who fails to produce one, will be examined in riding by the board and any extra expense incurred thereby will be borne by him.

798. Before promotion to the rank of substantive lieutenant-colonel an officer will be required to undergo a course at a senior officer's school and obtain a satisfactory report.

799. An officer may not attend a course unless—

(a) He has reached the substantive rank of Major.

(b) He is recommended for promotion in his annual confidential report.

(c) His C.O. certifies that he has tested the officer and recommends him as fit for the course and for promotion. This certificate will be countersigned by the District Commander under whom the officer is serving, who will add his remarks. Certificates laid down in (b), and (c) should accompany applications to attend the course.

800. In unforeseen circumstances where a major becomes due for promotion before attending the senior officer's school he may be promoted provisionally on the understanding that he attends the first available course and gets a satisfactory certificate.

In very exceptional cases a District Commander may submit to Militia Headquarters the name of a major to be excused attending the senior officers' school prior to promotion to substantive rank of lieutenant-colonel. It is essential that the officer should have held command of at least a battalion, or corresponding combatant unit, in the face of the enemy over an extended period.

The examination in these subjects may be taken up at any time after the completion of three years in the rank of major, and will usually be held in the District in which the officer is serving.

802. The examination in Part I will be held at the same time and place and under the same arrangements as directed for subjects (b), (d), (e) and (g) to (p) (paras. 782, 790, 794, 796 (iii) of these Regulations and Appendix XI, K.R. & O. (Imp.) 1912). All the technical subjects of Part I will be

803. The examination in Part II will be conducted under arrangements made by District Commanders at times and places most convenient to the District.

805. An officer who fails to pass in Part II will not, except in special cases when Militia Headquarters authority will be necessary, be allowed to present himself for re-examination within three months of his failure.
