REGULATIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS G. O. 134 FOR THE EQUIPMENT OF THE CAN-ADIAN MILITIA, 1930 - AMEND-MENTS (No. 36)

Regulations and Instructions for the Equipment of the Canadian Militia, 1930, are amended as follows, effective 1st August, 1938 -

After para. 206 insert the following new heading and paragraph: -

"H. Storage of Ammunition and Explosives

207. The provisions of Magazine Regulations will be strictly observed as regards storage of ammunition and explosives on units charge. Particular attention is drawn to the instructions regarding "classification", necessity for segregation and the conditions of storage of the various groups. In cases where, due to limited accommodation or other reasons, Magazine Regulations cannot be strictly complied with, the District Officer Commanding may permit storage in accordance with para. 188

DRESS REGULATIONS FOR THE ROYAL G. O. 137 CANADIAN AIR FORCE, 1925 -AMENDMENTS (No. 21)

Dress Regulations for the Royal Canadian Air Force, 1925, are amended as follows: -

Page 9 — Para. 4 (2), line five, delete the words "Khaki and Blue Braid" and substitute the words "Black and Blue Braid ".

Page 34 — Para. 55 Add new sub-para. 4 as follows: -

"4. When No. 5 Service Dress is worn G.O.137 in lieu of Full Dress, the aiguillette will be attached by means of a small hook sewn into the shoulder of the jacket so that the aiguillette hangs in the same position as when shoulder straps are worn.

- 3. No. 6 Service Dress (Summer).—As for other officers, with the exceptions and additions given under sub-para. 1 above.
- 4. Collar Badge. Maltese Cross in black metal with wings of gilt metal. "R. C.A.F." surrounded by wreath superimposed over centre of cross. Dress on which this badge is worn and position is as follows:
 - (a) No. 5 Service Dress (Winter) and No. 6 Service Dress (Summer). The centre of the bottom of the badge to be one inch above the inner end of the step opening of the collar, of the jacket, and the badge to be in such a position that the upright of the cross is parallel to the inside (rolled) edge, and midway between the inside (rolled) edge and outside of collar.
- (b) No. 3 Mess Dress and Mess Undress Jacket (Home). The top of the badge to be \(\frac{1}{4}\) inch below the inner end of the step opening of the jacket collar. The upright of the cross to be parallel to the inside (rolled) edge, and midway between inside (rolled) edge and outside of collar.

5. Cap Badge. — As 4 above, surmounted $\underline{G. 0.137}$ by crown in gold embroidery.

6. Scarf Badge. — Embroidered badge in red and gold of the same pattern as the cap badge on each end of the scarf. (Effective 27th August, 1938).

King's Regulations and Orders for the Royal Canadian Air Force, 1924, Permanent and Non-Permanent, are amended as follows:—

Page 27 Cancel existing paragraph 212A and substitute the following therefor:—

212A. A candidate for appointment to a Commission in the Active Air Force, Permanent and Non-Permanent, must be:-

(a) Of pure European descent and a British Subject, the son of parents both of whom are, or if deceased were at the time of their death, British subjects.

(b) Between the ages of 18 and 25 for General List Commissions and between the ages of 21 and 25 for Commissions in the Stores and Accounts Branch, on the 1st of June of the year in which the candidate is applying for entry.

(c) Certified by an authorized Medical Board as physically fit for service in accordance with Instructions for the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps and the Canadian Army Dental Corps, 1937.

In addition, a candidate for appointment to a Commission to a Unit of the Non-Permanent Active Air Force must, unless specially exempted, be resident within the recruiting area of such Unit.

(1) An officer qualified as in para. 213 (1) (a) and selected for a General List commission in the Permanent Active Air Force shall be appointed thereto as from the date of his Non-Permanent Commission referred to in para. 212E. On satisfactory completion of twelve months' service, including successful passing of the prescribed course of flying training, the officer will be confirmed in rank as from the date of provisional appointment. Seniority of Pilot Officers confirmed on the same date will be adjusted in accordance with the order of merit of passing the prescribed course of flying training.

(2) An airman pilot qualified as in para. 213 (1) (b) and selected for a General List commission in the Permanent Active Air Force shall be appointed effective the date recommended by the Director of the Royal Canadian Air Force. On satisfactory completion of twelve months' service, the officer will be confirmed in rank as from the date of provi-

sional appointment.

(3) A candidate, other than an airman, qualified as in para. 213 (1) (c) and selected for a Non-Flying List commission in the Permanent Active Air Force shall be appointed effective the date recommended by the Director of the Royal Canadian Air Force. On satisfactory completion of twelve months' service including successful passing of the prescribed course, the officer will be confirmed in rank as from the date of provisional appointment. Seniority of Pilot Officers confirmed on the same date will be adjusted in

(2) The promotion of officers granted commissions while serving as airmen pilots will be made, as a general rule, by seniority with other General List Officers up to the rank of Flight Lieutenant. Promotion to Squadron Leader's rank will be made by selection. Promotion beyond Squadron Leader's rank will only be considered for an officer in this category who has shown exceptional merit.

(3) Officers appointed to the Non-Flying List of the Permanent Active Air Force under para. 213D, may be promoted to the rank of Flight Lieutenant after five years' commissioned service and to the rank of Squadron Leader after twelve years' commissioned service. In the case of an exceptionally qualified officer accelerated promotion may be authorized. Such service will reckon from the date of their first commission in the Permanent Active Air Force providing it has been continuous service."
