# **Govt Announces \$3.7 Billion Contract for CAF Clothing and Footwear**

Over the next 20 years, \$3.7 billion will be poured into updating the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) clothing and footwear, the Government of Canada announced on Oct 20. The contract, awarded to Logistik Unicorp based in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec, will deliver approximately 1,222 different items of clothing and footwear worn by CAF members during their

deployments. "Today's investment will support thousands of well-paying jobs for Canadian workers and deliver modern, cutting-edge equipment for the members of the Canadian Armed Forces. "The CAF uniform is a source of great pride for Canadians at home and abroad, and this new contract with Logistik Unicorp will ensure that our members have the equipment they need, when they need it to fulfill the duties that we ask of them. I look forward to seeing the results of today's investment, which is great news for Quebecers and all Canadians," said Anita Anand, Minister of National Defence. Anand made the announcement this week on behalf of the Canadian government. According to a press release from the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF), the contract will provide supplies for more than 160,000 Canadian soldiers, including:



- Regular
- Reserve Force members,
- Canadian Rangers,
- Junior Rangers,
- Search and rescue technicians,
- Firefighters, and
- Cadets.

# The clothing provided under the contract includes:

- Combat uniforms using Canadian Disruptive Pattern (CADPAT) camouflage
- Badges and insignias
- Footwear, including combat boots, arid/hot weather boots, and mukluks
- Winter gear such as parkas, headwear and handwear
- Soldiers' personal equipment, such as sleeping bags and day packs.

According to the military, once the contract is in motion, members can order items online and have orders shipped to their door. However, the CAF will still be able to continue distributing uniforms directly to units. Distribution of clothing will begin in the second year of the contract, and individual online ordering is expected to start in the third year. "The members of the Canadian Armed Forces deserve the best uniforms and equipment required to effectively perform their duties. This contract delivers on this promise and provides military members with the needed operational clothing and footwear while also ensuring that the investment will benefit the

Canadian apparel, textile and footwear industry and thousands of its workers. Our government couldn't be prouder to simultaneously support both our troops and the workers at Logistik Unicorp and in its network of suppliers across the country," said François-Philippe Champagne, Minister of Innovation, Science and Industry. The contract also accounts for equipment in unexpected situations, such as the immediate supply of Personal Protective Equipment during critical emergencies.



According to the CAF, the contract will support more than 3,000 jobs in the clothing, footwear, and textile industries. In addition, it is expected that Logistik Unicorp will invest in research and development and skills training in these sectors, generating additional jobs. Furthermore, as part of the contract, Logistik must manufacture a majority of the clothing and footwear in Canada. According to the government, the contract will ensure "long-term, sustainable support for the Canadian apparel, textile and footwear sectors." The contract has incentives for Logistik to support Indigenous businesses. "This contract speaks to the Government of Canada's commitment to obtaining the best possible value for the Government and Canadians through open, fair and transparent procurement processes. It will provide CAF members with the necessary equipment to conduct daily operations anywhere in the world, while also creating economic benefits for Canadians," said Helena Jaczek, Minister of Public Services and According to the CAF press release, Logistik has experience in Procurement Canada. incorporating Gender-based Analysis Plus. "Procured items will meet the requirements of the diverse CAF population with a faster turnaround time," stated the press release.

# NATO's Sentinel Planes Warn of Russia's Ukraine Battlefield Moves

Intelligence from sophisticated system quietly provides near real-time picture of Russian forces David Common · CBC News · Oct 22, 2022

CBC's David Common gets rare access to NATO's sophisticated surveillance aircraft that monitors Russian war activity in and around

Ukraine, and provides information to allies, allowing Ukraine to quickly respond. As the military pilots on board one of NATO's airborne warning and command planes skirt just inside Poland's border with Ukraine, the real action is happening metres behind them. Surveillance operators and weapons controllers crowd around one of the multitude of radar screens peering deep inside wartime Ukraine. They would not describe what was happening, due to the sensitive nature of real-time intelligence on Russian military moves. But it is clear they've spotted something using the massive radar dome mounted to the E-3, a plane the size of a commercial airliner but filled with advanced surveillance and communications equipment. "We are able to detect and identify everything flying around us in a really big circle," said Sgt Joao, who, like nearly all the crew, provides only his first name for security reasons. In mid-October, CBC News was granted rare access on board the Airborne Warning and Control System (AWACS) aircraft, one of 14 in NATO's Germany-based fleet that routinely gathers intelligence through radar and other surveillance technologies of land sea and air, providing NATO allies with a view of the battlefield during combat.

As Ukraine takes back territory in its fight with the invading Russians, it is clear western intelligence has been a key component to their success, including the

big picture offered by the AWACS. Commanders did acknowledge the unclassified capabilities of the system, which can "see" at least 400 kilometres beyond the aircraft, tracking Russian warplanes as they approach Ukrainian airspace, navy ships positioning for attack, and Russia's larger drones. Even, in some circumstances, the movements of tanks and other military vehicles. The AWACS aircraft can determine the paths of missiles, as well as aircraft, says professor Walter Dorn of the Royal Military College of Canada. "In fact, its resolution is such that it can track flocks of geese." "In Crimea now, we see a lot of activity," said Sgt Joao, acknowledging the efforts by Russia to push back a surging Ukrainian counter-offensive in the south.

Officially, the information is immediately sent to only NATO nations. However, it is widely acknowledged that some among them quickly share the intelligence with Ukraine's Armed Forces, which could use it to counter an incoming attack and to better understand Russia's broader moves across the entire battlefield. "Essentially, the Western intelligence data provides Ukrainian planners with a near real-time picture of Russian forces, which in turn enables Ukrainian planners to organize efficient combat operations," said Andrew Rasiulis of the Canadian Global Affairs Institute. The classified nature of their work limits the information the crew can share — and the radar images CBC News was able to photograph — but one long-serving member on the aircraft described it as the "most useful work of my career." Another described sending alerts as Russian planes approached Snake Island in the Black Sea on a bombing run this summer. The island holds tremendous symbolism for Ukrainians after its soldiers posted there radioed an attacking vessel to "F--k off, Russian warship." More recently, the airborne command planes have been early sentries to the departure of Russian fighter jets from Crimea after Ukrainian forces punched

through the Russian front lines in the south, a move that could ultimately threaten Russia's occupation of the strategic peninsula, which it annexed from Ukraine in 2014.

Officially, NATO only shares the intelligence it gathers with member nations of the military alliance. But it is widely known that some of those nations immediately pass on the information to Ukraine's Armed Forces for immediate use.

Although vastly outnumbered, Ukraine's Air Force continues to function, attacking Russian warplanes and ground targets. One AWACS crew member described "Russian radar signatures disappearing," either after dogfights with Ukrainian fighter jets or engagement by a surface to air missile. None would elaborate on their own role in such actions, citing the sensitivities of NATO allies providing real-time intelligence to Ukraine, itself not a member of the alliance. But some were permitted to discuss recent incidents, including Senior Master Sergeant Elissa, an American on the multinational crew. "When we watch Ukrainian fighters taking off, protecting their airspace and going after Russian fighters," said the surveillance operator in front of an illuminated screen littered with hundreds of symbols tracking Russian positions on the ground and air, "they're fighting back and taking control of the country they love."



The AWACS operates specifically to monitor aircraft in a war zone, but has powerful surveillance tools allowing it to see in great detail more than 400 km away. They can track drones, tanks and much more—providing real-time information and a broader sense of what Russia is planning over time.

Russia has loudly criticized the transfer of weapons and intelligence to Ukraine and has threatened to respond. One crew member on board the AWACS said occasionally Russian warplanes have flown directly toward it at high speed – while maintaining a wide distance. "It is definitely a different

situation," said Major Wayne, the aircraft's commander. He has worked adjacent to war zones in the past with the US Air Force, including the Middle East where "they didn't have a capable air force threat that we were concerned about, whereas here there is a much greater threat." The NATO plane has limited defensive capabilities but does occasionally fly with fighter jet escorts. There are no publicly known incidents when Russian aircraft have crossed into NATO airspace to harass the AWACS plane during the Ukraine war. On Thursday, Britain's defence minister said a Russian fighter jet had released a missile near an unarmed British spy plane similar to NATO's aircraft as it patrolled in international airspace over the Black Sea on Sept. 29. Defence Minister Ben Wallace told Parliament it was an apparent accident and not a deliberate escalation of tensions, noting that the Russians had investigated and blamed a technical malfunction. Rasiulis pointed out that the Russians now view the war as a de facto war between NATO and

Russia, harkening back to the darkest days of the Cold War. "The key was always, and remains so today, to avoid direct combat between the US/NATO and Russia."

All those aboard are cautious about what they disclose. 'Foreign intelligence agencies can take things that we say, things that are reported, as puzzle pieces,' says Major Wayne, the aircraft commander on this NATO flight.

The AWACS often stays airborne for 12 or more hours, refuelled in flight by a US Air Force tanker. Combined with similar surveillance aircraft operated by multinational crews in the United States, France and others, they maintain a near round-the-clock picture of the Ukrainian battlefield. And not just on land. "AWACS can also track ships in the Black Sea, giving Ukraine both warning and targeting information," noted Dorn. "The maritime tracking can also help implement Western sanctions on Russian products." After years of exercises, one crew member on board the plane who couldn't be named because of constraints by his home nation described, "feeling that we are making a difference against the enemy."

The lone Canadian on the AWACS aircraft is Capt Colin Wiley. As the surveillance controller, all detections are routed to him for confirmation and

immediate transmission to ground-based operations centres. Wiley has watched many times on his screen as a Russian aircraft, "goes down low-level, pops back up," in what was most likely a bombing run. It's a surreal task, he says. "I wake up in the morning in my bed, fly orbits over here on the eastern flank, and then I go back home and sleep in my bed at night, and it makes me think about those who can't leave [the war]." Even as the AWACS turns back to its base in Geilenkirchen, Germany, after a mission that began before sunrise and ends after sunset, another NATO surveillance plane is already airborne, maintaining a near-constant watch of Ukraine's skies and much more.

# Who (or What) Is It?

Last Week: The common thread here is Major General Sir Percy Cleghorn Stanley Hobart, KBE,



CB, DSO, MC. General Sir Archibald Wavell dismissed Hobart into retirement in 1940, based on hostile War Office information due to his "unconventional" ideas about armoured warfare. Hobart joined the Local Defence Volunteers (precursor to the Home Guard) as a lance

corporal and was charged with the defence of his

hometown, Chipping Campden. "At once, Chipping Campden became a hedgehog of bristling defiance", and Hobart was promoted

to become Deputy Area Organiser. Hobart 'invented' the pike that the Home Guard used while awaiting rifles.



Liddell Hart criticized the decision to retire Hobart and wrote an article in the newspaper *Sunday Pictorial*. Winston Churchill was notified, and he had Hobart recalled into the army over Chief of the Imperial General Staff General Sir Alan Brooke's objections in 1941. Hobart went on to design a series of tank modifications that became known as Hobart's funnies, including a fascine layer as shown in the last picture.

This Week: Our list of Victoria Cross holders seems to have stalled at the end of the Second World War, with Robert Hampton Gray being our last recipient of that most valued and prestigious award. While other Commonwealth nations have given their versions to brave men in both Iraq and Afghanistan, our leaders have chosen to keep the Canadian version in the vault, in spite of a petition to the House of Commons (that was rejected earlier this year). Sour grapes aside, I, like many of my age, was privileged to have met several of the brave VC holders, all of whom have now joined their comrades in the legion of the dead. To a man, they were kind, generous, and friendly, something I will remember until I, too, join them and all those who went before us. One other characteristic they had in common was that they were also modest, and rather dismissive of what they had done, with this week's spotlighted fellow replying to the inevitable question of what "it" had been like by saying, "It was 15 minutes of terror, and a lifetime of free lunches".





This brings us to our quiz. We have Smokey Smith's portrait, in his full

wartime Seaforth kit, and a photo of something he probably never encountered. All draw prizes will be available as your choice of the table, first come, first served. Take whatever you want from what is left on the table. Presumably the larger value prizes will be picked up early in the draw, but it is the ticket holder's choice what he or she takes. We will still need your name for our records, so a recorder will

be sitting at the prize table to get your name for the item you take. Also, each winner will come to the MC and draw the next ticket before choosing their prize from the table.

The raffle ticket proceeds are applied to our annual donation to the BC Provincial Committee of the Air Cadet League of Canada as well as to subsidize this and other AFOA events and activities.

#### **Parking Details:**

Besides those with veterans' licence plates, who can now park free at City of Vancouver metres or City and Parks Board lots, there are several options for parking at the Masonic Centre.

The parkade below the Masonic Centre normally cost \$ 4/hour or \$ 12/day, but we have been able to negotiate **FREE PARKING** for the Dawn Patrol. **Please park on Level P2**.

**Other Parking Options:** There is street parking on 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Avenues and Hemlock Street, which may be fairly empty on Remembrance Day, being a statutory holiday.

On the North side of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, there are about 18 "residential" parking spots...no metres, no signs and no time limits, but not much chance you will find one empty!!

On the South side of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, there are about 16 "pay by licence number" spots. There are also, on 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 6 parking meters - \$ 2/hour, 2-hour limit, near Granville St. On 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue, there are about 16 \$2/hr - 2-hour metered spots, 4 "pay by licence" spots and 6 "park by Permit" spots for residents....do **not** park in the Permit spots!!

Around the corner on Hemlock St.(West side between  $7^{th}$  and 8th), there are 6 or 7 spots, with no metres, no signs and no time limits exept for no parking 3 - 6 PM.

#### Access:

The main door at the front of the building is 1464 West 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, but for those of you who may choose to park on West 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue, there is also an entrance at 1463 West 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue (MCDLXIII), which I expect will also be open for us. Parkade access is off the lane.

#### **Breakfast Buffet:**

We have usually had a sit-down served breakfast, but costs of catering have soared!!

The breakfast will be a buffet of Cheesy Scrambled Eggs with Smoky Bacon, Fresh Cut Hash Browns with Green Onions, a selection of Danishes, Muffins and Mini-Croissants, served with Whipped Butter and Preserves. Sounds better than what was available in the World War One mess tent after a crew returned from the Dawn Patrol, and we hope that the petrified 10-year-old jam packages were all destroyed when the former Masonic Centre was torn down.




