The term "Me Decade" for the 70s described an attitude of towards individualism. People's Republic of China recognized by United Nations. OPEC embargo. Japan's economy overtook West Germany, anti-war protests against the Vietnam War grew, Kent State shootings, first Earth Day, first email transmission, energy crisis peaked in 1973 and 1979, gasoline rationed in many countries, King of Saudi Arabia assassinated, President of Bangladesh and almost his entire family assassinated during coup d'etat, U.S. President Gerald Ford nearly assassinated twice, plot to assassinate President Jimmy Carter foiled, Prime Minister of Italy kidnapped and later killed by the Red Brigades, Three Mile Island accident, SALT II treaty signed by Jimmy Carter and Leonid Brezhnev, Margaret Thatcher elected prime

Minister in United Kingdom, WHO certified the eradication of smallpox, October Crisis in Canada, Skyjack Sunday when four airliners were hijacked with over 300 people as hostage, Croatian Spring movement demanded greater decentralization of power, Bangladesh Liberation War, Munich massacre at Summer Olympics, Martial law declared in the Philippines , Yom Kippur War in 1973, Lebanese Civil War started, Cambodian Communist leader Pol Pot and the Khmer Rouge captured Phnom Penh, Western Sahara War, Soweto Uprising in South Africa, Egyptian–Israeli Peace Treaty late 70s, Ogaden War between Somali and Ethiopa, Ugandan–Tanzanian War started, Vietnam invaded Cambodia, China and Vietnam engaged in a brief war, Soviet invades Afghanistan, Saddam Hussein assumes presidency of Iraq, Islamic republic of Iran established under Ayatollah Khomeini, Rhodesian Bush War continued, Red Brigades and the Baader-Meinhof Gang were responsible for a spate of bombings, kidnappings, and murders in West Germany, violence continued in Northern Ireland, Weather Underground and the Symbionese Liberation Army formed in the USA.

Bhola cyclone kills an estimated 500,000 people in East Pakistan, Tonghai earthquake in China kills between 10,000–14,000 with another 26,783 injured, Ancash earthquake in Peru kills more than 47,000, Cyclone in the Bay of Bengal kills 10,000 in India, Hurricane Agnes kills 128 in the United States and causes over \$2.1 Billion, Super Outbreak produces 148 tornadoes and kills a total of 330 people in the United States, Cyclone Tracy devastates the city of Darwin In Australia, Bangladesh famine of 1974 claims a death toll between 26,000 and 1,000,000, Banqiao Dam, in China, fails after a freak typhoon with over 200,000 people perishing, major earthquake in Guatemala and Honduras kills more than 22,000, magnitude 7.5 earthquake flattens Tangshan, China, killing 242,769 people and injuring 164,851, magnitude 8 earthquake struck Moro Gulf in Mindanao Philippines causes a tsunami killing 5,000 to 8,000 people.






UN Disengagement Observation Force (UNDOF)
